**Requirements**

- [Proof of Identity](#)<sup>1</sup>
- [Proof of Residency](#)<sup>1</sup>
- [Social Security Number](#)<sup>1</sup>
- If the name does not appear the same on all documents presented, see [Name Changes and Usage](#).<sup>1</sup>
- [Appropriate fees.](#)

**Driver's License Transfer**

- All items listed in **Requirements** are necessary to obtain a driver's license.
- Your most recently issued license from a previous state (must be surrendered)
  - You will need to provide a driving record, containing name, date of birth, and driver's license number, if you are unable to provide your driver's license from the last state of issuance **and** you are from the following states:
    - California, Connecticut, Illinois, Nevada, or West Virginia
- A vision test will be done prior to driver's license issuance.
- Note that you may only hold one valid driver's license issued by any state at one time.<sup>1,2</sup>
- If you would like to upgrade at the time of transfer, see [Classes of Licenses and Age Requirements](#).<sup>3</sup>
- Any minor wishing to transfer, see [Authorization/Licensing of a Minor's Application for Driver's License](#).
- You are required to have insurance if you have a vehicle registered in Louisiana, see [Acceptable Evidence of Insurance Coverage](#).
- If transferring a valid commercial license (Class A, B, C) from another state, you will not have to take the written skills test, except for Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT). You are required to pass the Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT) knowledge test prior to issuance. CDL permits will **not** be transferred.

## Identification Card

- All items listed in **Requirements** are necessary to obtain an identification card. However, you are **not** required to surrender your out-of-state driver's license.
- It is important to note, that your driving privileges may be cancelled by your home state upon issuance of a Louisiana identification card. Please contact the previous issuing state for more information.
- If you have a valid Real ID driver's license in another state and want to obtain a Real ID identification card in Louisiana, you must surrender your Real ID driver's license. If your Real ID driver's license is suspended and you want to get a Real ID identification card in Louisiana, you do not have to surrender your Real ID driver's license.

## Notes:

- All documents must have the same name. If the names are different, other than by marriage, the application will be denied until the supporting documents have been changed to reflect the name change. If the out-of-state license already shows the married name of the applicant, a marriage license/certificate is not required.
- If you want a [Real ID](#) credential in Louisiana, and have not had one in this State, you must submit all original documentation required for Real ID, regardless of if you had a Real ID credential in another State.
