<b>Description of Incident:</b> <p>The New Orleans Police is investigating an incident that occurred at a location off SUNO's campus. The victim stated that he was allegedly shot at by an unknown male at that off campus location. The victim stated that he fled from his attacker, where he was chased and then sought refuge on SUNO's campus. No one was injured in this incident. In addition, preliminary investigation indicates the incident is isolated and there are not any imminent threats to the University.</p> <p>The New Orleans Police are currently gathering evidence and information in an effort to identify persons involved in this incident.</p> <p>If anyone has information regarding this incident, please contact the New Orleans Police Department.</p> <p>This information is being released in accordance with the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The Clery Act requires all colleges and universities that participate in federal financial aid programs to keep and disclose information about crime on and near their respective campuses, including timely warnings of crimes that may represent a serious or ongoing threat to the safety of students or employees.</p> <p>All residents should make certain their doors and windows are secured.
