

HOMICIDE BY SHOOTING INCIDENT

The New Orleans Police Department is investigating a homicide that occurred at the intersection of Leroy Johnson and Lakeshore Drives. On April 11, 2022, the shooting happened at approximately 9:10 pm, when a man was shot multiple times. The victim was pronounced deceased overnight at the hospital.

Note: This incident occurred near the campus but currently does not have any affiliation with the university.

This information is being released in accordance with the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1990. The Clery Act requires all colleges and universities that participate in federal financial aid programs to keep and disclose information about crime on and near their respective campuses, including timely warnings of crimes that may represent a serious or ongoing threat to the safety of students or employees.

All residents, students, faculty, and staff should remember that safety is everyone's responsibility, and all suspicious activity should be reported to SUNO Police Department at 504-286-3355.
