The SUNO Police Department may be accepting applications for POLICE OFFICER. Positions are in a training series, the level of positions filled, and pay above entry will depend on the qualifications of candidates selected. Must have a score for the 9500-LEAPS Exam unless currently occupying a Civil Service job in the LEAPS Test Series with permanent status or re-employment eligibility.

DUTIES OF A SUNO OFFICER

Police officers protect the lives and property of citizens. A SUNO Police Officer's duties and responsibilities can vary from day to day. These duties and responsibilities can often range from highly dangerous and highly physical work to paperwork or desk tasks. Whatever the assignment may be, a police officer is expected to carry out the commands of his supervisors and to enforce the law ethically in the area under his/her iurisdiction.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

One year of experience in law enforcement work.

SUBSTITUTIONS

College training will substitute for the required experience on the basis of thirty semester hours for the year of experience.

NECESSARY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Must have the eighteenth birthday at the time of application.

An applicant who has been convicted of a felony or who is under indictment on a felony charge will be disqualified until relief from the disabilities imposed by state and federal laws is granted.

May be required to possess a valid Louisiana driver's license at the time of appointment.

Required to complete a Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) course.

For some positions, evidence of POST certification must be submitted at the time of the application.

May be required to qualify annually with a firearm.

For some positions, the applicant must be eligible for bond.

A drug screen will be administered prior to employment.

SUNOPD

is the primary law enforcement agency on property owned and leased by the university. The dedicated men and women of the police department protect and serve the university 24 hours a day, every day. In addition to the Office of the Chief, the police department is comprised of three divisions:

- 1. Support Services
- 2. Investigations
- 3. Operations

The police officers who staff these divisions are duly sworn, certified, armed, and empowered with the same authority as other local law enforcement officers in the State of Louisiana.
