AUTO THEFT

The Southern University at New Orleans and New Orleans Police Departments are investigating an alleged auto theft that occurred on Saturday, November 19, 2022, at approximately 10:00 AM. It was reported that a blue Dodge Charger was reported stolen after being parked in Lot H between the Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences Building and the SUNO Gym.
